#### **News**

A huge thank you to everyone for your very generous donations for The Vale Foodbank - I believe it has been our most successful collection to date. We celebrated our harvest this morning with a special worship, where we marked this important time in the church calendar and thanked God for all the food that we are so lucky to have.

Last week we welcomed 4 PGCE students from Cardiff Met University. The students will be with us until Christmas and will be teaching alongside the teachers and have been allocated classes as indicated below.

All committees have now been elected and will meet around once a fortnight, initially to plan their activities for the year ahead. Diwrnod Shwmae is a day marked each year in Wales to celebrate and promote the Welsh language. *Shwmae* is an informal greeting used to start a conversation. The day is celebrated on 15 October each year in order to promote community use of the language and encourage non-Welsh speakers to consider learning the language. The Criw Cymraeg met yesterday and would like to ask the children to come into school wearing red, white and/or green for Dydd Shwmae next Fri the 13th Oct.

We are very grateful to the paramedics (including one of our very own parents of Isla in Year 6) for their excellent CPR training and also for teaching Year 6 all about how to use a defibrillator. 2 classes also had visits from our community police officer, PC Alex. Reception learned about 'People who help us' and Year 2 discussed 'Right or Wrong'.





### Curriculum Activities – updates from each class teacher

Dosbarth Meithrin's focus is 'Autumn' which will enable us to talk to the children about the natural changes that happen during this very special season, including how the weather changes, why trees lose their leaves, and how wild animals prepare for winter. We are already using the idyllic grounds of our school to engage the children in memorable experiences, especially in our Emerald Forest, where lots of our learning is taking place. As well as all this, we are supporting the children with settling into the routines of school life, encouraging them to make new friends and to feel confident. We will be reminding them about the unique and special importance of people in their family, school and local community, who can help and support them.

**Dosbarth Derbyn's** topic is 'Me & My Community'. They have discussed how we are all different and unique, painted self-portraits and drawn their families. Reception have created their own class rules, highlighting the importance of friendship and kindness. This week, we had an exciting visit from our community police officer and have been learning all about the people who help us in and around our community.

**Blwyddyn 1**'s topic is 'Ysgol' (School). We went for a walk around the school and saw Mrs Hallett's office and the staffroom! We have been looking at what Victorian schools were like. We decided our class rules meant our school is much more caring and kinder than in those days. We asked our parents and grandparents what school was like for them. We are now looking forward to going to see a real Victorian school in St Fagans after half term.

**Blwyddyn 2**'s topic is called 'Movers and Shakers' - a historical topic looking at significant people in the past. The children have done self-portraits in the style of Vincent van Gogh and have used Dawson's model to explore the significance of historical people. They've also grouped significant people into different categories (activists, monarchs, explorers, etc.) and have used diamond ranking to share their own views on these significant people. Next week we will be looking at timelines.

**Blwyddyn 3**'s topic is 'Rocks, Relics and Rumbles'. They have been extremely busy making erupting volcanoes using natural resources during outdoor learning, learning about the four layers of the earth, and investigating different rocks and their properties and uses. They have also produced some fantastic volcano artwork using oil pastels and written creative sentences about earthquakes, volcanoes, mountains and tsunamis.



Blwyddyn 4's topic is 'Misty Mountain, Winding River'. The children have been looking at Welsh rivers and where they are situated, including the upper, middle and lower courses. They also looked at the characteristics and physical processes of rivers, including how they shape the landscape over time. Taking their learning outside, Year 4 made their own rivers for outdoor learning and investigated what happened when water flowed down them. They finished the river part of the topic by looking at rivers around the world, locating them on a world map, collecting data on river lengths and then using the data to create a bar graph. Year 4 are now looking forward to learning all about mountains!

**Blwyddyn 5** have fully immersed themselves into our new topic 'Sow, Grow and Farm' and I have been really impressed with their knowledge of farming so far. During the topic so far, we have looked at allotments and we've had an enjoyable debate regarding the best locations for allotments and what they need in order to be successful. The children provided excellent counter arguments to one another backed up with facts and statistics - we may have a few young budding politicians in our midst! We have also looked at the role of the farmer and the tasks and challenges that they face throughout the year. The children have also had the opportunity to learn about farming in the United Kingdom and the techniques used in modern farming.

**Blwyddyn 6**'s topic 'Maafa' teaches children about Africa past and present. It traces the development of the slave trade and explores Britain's role in the transatlantic slave trade, the causes and consequences of the European colonisation of Africa and the worldwide communities that make up the African diaspora. The children were immersed in Maafa and Africa last week. They played a game to locate African countries on a map, created and played African music on drums, researched an African country, and made and tasted a delicious African drink called Sobia.

### Message from Father Andrew (Repeated)
