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

PTA

The Local Authority have confirmed that school budgets are being cut this April. We already struggle to keep the staffing levels that we have but I feel strongly that staffing is by far the most important 'resource' for our pupils. Once all the other costs are taken into account including increasing fuel costs, building repairs and consumables, etc. there is very little left. This means that the extra funding which the PTA provide is going to be more important than ever. Mrs Bayliss and I met with some of the committee this week and we are really keen to improve links between the PTA and school whilst improving the 'community' feel of our school which we feel has been affected since the Covid period. We are therefore planning a PTA coffee morning on the last Thursday of each month. This will be an opportunity to find out more about what the PTA is doing and planning, whilst maybe having a catch up with friends. The coffee mornings will take place in the school demountable 'Y Stiwdio' at 9am. The planned dates are as follows:

Punctuality

Whilst I am aware that there were issues with traffic and congestion this morning, I am increasingly concerned by the number of children who are late each day. I am particularly concerned by an increasing number of children who are regularly late. This has a massive impact on the child as they are beginning the day after their peers and are often missing out on daily phonics and spelling which takes place first thing in almost all classes. They also miss the daily, individual meet and greet from the class teacher on the door which we have recently introduced as part of our well-being and positive relationships practices. Children arriving late is also disruptive for the rest of the class.

We do record all lates on the register and we will continue to monitor individual children closely. We will be returning to our pre covid system straight after half term. From Tuesday 28th February, after 08:50, parents will need to come in to sign their child in at the office. Please note, this includes older children - it will not be acceptable to drop them off and let them come in to school alone as this presents a safeguarding risk. I am grateful to the majority who do ensure their children are on time every day and hope we can improve this as a whole school.

There are a number of ParentPay accounts which are in arrears. Please ensure all debts are cleared and that accounts are always kept in credit. Thank you.

As you will have heard in the media, the NEU rejected the Welsh Government's latest offer and therefore will be striking on Thursday March 2nd. We have always been very proud of how smart our pupils look and we are very grateful for the support of parents and carers with this. We are aware of the issues around the cost of living but it is important to remember that school uniform can help with the following:

- Protecting children from social pressures to dress in a particular way.
- Making children feel equal with their peers.
- Preventing children from coming to school in fashion items that could be distracting in class.
