Year 1 went on an exciting trip to Cardiff on Monday. They walked down to the station and went on a very train ride instead of using a bus. Mrs Day and Mrs Fleet said that the children were extremely well behaved with members of the public actually going out of their way to make positive comments. We are very grateful to the volunteers who accompanied the class, as this was essential, given the amount of walking and the use of the train.

Year 4 held a super class worship yesterday all around the theme of water. They talked about their new topic 'Blue Abyss' and performed a song in recognition of world ocean week. We have been asked to create some art designs for Llandaff Cathedral. The purpose of the task is for each school to create a panel of a stained-glass window and we have been asked to create images for Noah's Ark. When each panel has been completed, they will be pieced together digitally to create a large illustration of a stained-glass window. On Wednesday, Year 3 and 4 met John Patrick Green, the bestselling author/illustrator of the 'InvestiGATORS' He told the children all about how he had started drawing and how he had become an author and illustrator. The classes were also joined by Mel from Griffin books.



### **Curriculum work**



Year 1's topic is Cardiff Tales. They had a lovely walk around Dinas Powys last week looking at human features and then this week they had a walk and an open top bus ride around Cardiff looking at all the landmarks. They saw the Principality Stadium, Cardiff Castle and the Norwegian Church. They also studied the Betty Campbell statue in real life and remembered a lot of facts about her.

Year 5 enjoyed a Tudor immersion day last week. They all took part in Tudor dancing, designed Tudor coats of arms, looked at Tudor clothing and learnt how to play Tudor themed songs on the glocks. They also looked at famous sports from Tudor times and made the Tudor rose out of clay.



To finish their Hola Mexico topic, Y6 planned a parade which involved music, instruments and dances. They put it all together themselves and performed it in front of Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 on the field. Year 6 have loved the topic and enjoyed finishing it in this way. They then showed their Reception buddies the masks and the stelae (monuments) that we made.

Today, Year 3 and Year 6 are working together. Year 6 are going to be showing the Year 3's how to code using Scratch Junior and the MicroBits.
