#### News

What a busy couple of weeks we have had back in school. To mark the start of a new year, the children took part in activities to learn about the Welsh tradition of Calennig which takes place on 13<sup>th</sup> January every year. In some classes, each child made a perllan. Year 6 learned about the Mari Llwyd and others compared life in Wales in the past with the present.



The children are now immersed in their topics. As part of their study of World War 2 Year 6 have been baking using rationed ingredients and learning how morse code was used. Year 2 started their 'Muck, Mess and Mixtures' topic with a fun and messy morning earlier this week. The children made lava lamps, rice rainbows and much



more. Nursery are having great fun with their topic 'Where does Snow Go?' We are really pleased with how our topics are engaging the children and how positive the outcomes are for all pupils. We are continually reflecting, reviewing and adapting our curriculum to ensure it is the best it can be.

The weather has been particularly challenging over the last few weeks, but the children have been very sensible and listened to instructions as to how to stay safe. Next week, please remember to ensure your child has a suitable coat in school. A number of older pupils are coming to school with only a fleece which is not suitable when the weather is damp.

## St Dwynwen's Day PTA Disco

# Arrangements will be as follows:

**Reception to Year 2** – This disco will take place during the afternoon. The children can then be collected as usual at 3:10-3:20pm. The bus and Deb's afterschool club will run as usual. Any children who do not wish to attend will have activities in one classroom.

**Year 3 to Year 6** – This disco will take place from 3:10 at the end of the day. The children can then be collected from the playground at 4:20 (The children will line up as usual on the playground at the front). Any children who attend afterschool club will be taken to the Stiwdio as usual. Obviously children who stay for the disco will not be able to go on the bus and will need to be collected from school.
