We were so pleased that the weather didn't spoil the Y3, Y4 and Y5 visits to Barry Island. The children enjoyed travelling by train (which also kept the price down!) and thoroughly enjoyed playing and paddling on the sand with their friends and teachers.





Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 enjoyed a wonderful trip to Cefn Mably Farm. They were allowed to pet and feed the animals, had a super fun train ride and even managed to fit in a session on the soft play.

Thank you so much to all our parents and governors who volunteered to go on the trips. Without your support, we would not meet the required ratios for health and safety and would struggle to go.

Just to update you, we are delighted that we raised £165 on our Refugee Week non-uniform day. Nancy, Maddie and Mrs Squires went down to The Oasis Centre to give them our donation and to find out more about the work that they do to support refugees who come to South Wales. In terms of curriculum, topics have come to an end with many interesting activities having taken place. Nursery and Reception have really impressed the Early Years staff with their curious and independent learning around the outdoor environment. They have been excellent problem-solvers, built on their physical development and resilience, and have shown confidence through exploration. We feel very fortunate to have such a brilliant outdoor learning environment. Year 1 enjoyed the end of their mini topic, 'Paws Claws and Whiskers' by going on a hunt in the Faith Garden looking for their camouflaged, decorated butterflies. Year 2 ended their 'Land Ahoy!' topic with a fun treasure hunt around the school grounds. Year 3 have been busy being scientists with their topic 'Mighty Metals', investigating forces and magnetism. Year 4's topic 'Blue Abyss' saw them creating scale models of deep-sea creatures, using oil pastels for some stunning art work and researching all about the Great Barrier Reef. Year 5 have enjoyed their topic 'Roses and Royals'. Alongside preparing for their class worship, they enjoyed a lot of expressive arts such as drawing famous Tudors, creating a Tudor shield and creating Tudor houses using Minecraft for Education.

### **Petition on funding**

I am sure you are aware that school budgets are in a very concerning state – with large numbers of schools being forced to set deficit budgets this year and even more likely next year. What you may not be aware of, is that the funding formula which Welsh Government use to allocate funding to Local Authorities has not been reviewed for many decades, meaning that The Vale of Glamorgan receive less per pupil than in any other Local Authority in Wales. Governors from a number of Local Authorities are calling on the Welsh Government to urgently review the budget situation saying children's education and safety is at risk with cuts to staff, larger classes and a reduced curriculum. Headteachers in The Vale of Glamorgan have real concerns around the lack of support for pupils with additional learning needs and for those with emotional and behavioural difficulties. Governing bodies and school leaders have come together to launch a petition to draw attention to what they say is a Wales-wide problem.

As parents, I urge you to please sign this petition and to share with families and friends. If the petition reaches 10,000 signatures, it will be considered for a debate in the Senedd.

### Water Safety – a message from the RNLI

As we enter the holidays, we are all hoping for some lovely weather, so I thought I would share some information on staying safe near water. There has been a stark increase in the number of tragedies in and around water four people under 20 died in accidental drownings in Wales in 2022 – the highest number since comparable data became available. In total, there were 22 deaths in Wales from accidental drowning in 2022 across inland and coastal locations, and we have already seen a number of drowning fatalities this year. Please remind the children of four simple life saving tips to help them stay safe around open water.
